## Dear Friends and Colleagues,

As the Project Director, it is my pleasure to share the progress of the Leadership to Ensure Adequate Nutrition (LEAN) project which is being implementing in the Chittagong Hill Tracts (CHT).

While Bangladesh has made significant progress in improving nutrition in line with MDGs, the three CHT districts are lagging behind due to many reasons. It is to address these challenges and improve the nutritional situation of these three districts that the consortium partners have undertaken this project with funding from the European Union. The overall objective of LEAN is to contribute to improved maternal and child nutrition in CHT.

Over the last year, the COVID-19 pandemic has had enormous impact globally, including in the project areas of LEAN. Due to the pandemic, the government of Bangladesh limited people's movement as well as all sorts of activities. In spite of this serious pandemic and necessary lockdowns, all the frontline staff and central level staff of LEAN project adopted alternative approaches and kept the activities going. As a result of this; most of the project activities continued. I would therefor like to thank all of LEAN staff for their dedication and endless effort to keep the work continuing. Their hard work helped the project enter into its third year smoothly. The dedication and hard work of LEAN project staff give me hope that all planned work of year 3 will be completed despite whatever challenges we face.

For the first time, union level multi stakeholder To achieve national nutrition target indicators outlined in for hill district, but also in Bangladesh. There have been 72 MSPs formed in 72 unions in CHT. The union level multi stakeholder platform is comprised of traditional leaders like, Karbari, Headman, Union parishad chairman, Union parishad member, School teacher, Local elites, Government officers, and Private sector stakeholders, who were also included in this committee.

This platforms will act as a bridge among Upazila level Nutrition Coordination Committees. Upazila Parishads, Hill District Councils, local government institutions, community leaders and community people. Through this process, nutrition demand will be reached at upazila to district and up to national level and the Bangladesh National Nutrition Council, Ministry of Chittagong Hill Tracts. UNCCs have been created as

an opportunity to strengthen linkages among Union in their communities. The UNCCs are also enabling Parishad, Upazila Parishad and Hill district council to nutrition needs assessments and close coordination with achieving nutrition outcomes in Chittagong Hill Tracts Union Parishad planning processes to ensure they (CHT) region.

Before LEAN interventions, nutrition actors formed different committees in various forms, most without any community level input. They did not do any nutrition related activities especially on nutrition sensitization and

specific awareness.

platforms (MSP) for nutrition, have been formed the 7<sup>th</sup> five year plan and SDG 2030, Bangladesh in the Chittagong Hill Districts. This is not only first time government has approved 10-year (2016-2025) Second National Plan of Action for Nutrition (NPAN2) in 2017 and grounded it through the Upazila level and District level Nutrition Coordination Committees. These two committees are characterized by multi-stakeholder inclusion which aims to engage all three types of traditional institutions in CHT (Karbari, Headmen, and

> Circle Chiefs) along with the Hill District Councils. The Union Nutrition Coordination Committees are a vital linkage between the upazila and district committees and will ensure better coordination and community ownership.

> These sentiments have already been expressed by the Headmen and Karbaries who say they feel improved ownership of nutrition development

This month, a nutrition fair was held at Tulaban high school grounds in Rangamati Hill District. The chief guests was the honorable Upazilla Nirbahi Officer (UNO) of Baghaichari Upazilla. The Principal of Kachalong Govt Degree College, Upazila Secondary Education Officer, and UP Chairman, The President of Tulaban SMC was also present in this programme. The Fair was presided over by the Headmaster of Tulaban high school. WBCs, LSPs (Agriculture & Livestock), Adolescents, Students and the Health department all set up stalls and participated in this event which was attended by students and community peoples from the community who gained knowledge on nutrition, sanitation and hygiene.

(LSP) are an ideal model for sustainable service the expansion of LSPs by providing technical training provision to local farmers.

"Private Local Service Provision" is the way in which efficient quality services are made available to people in their own communities using local resource persons with advanced skills and knowledge. Due to limited access to technical services for poor producers, LEAN project has applied the concept of private local service provision in Chittagong Hill Track (CHT).

The concept relies on the idea that farmers have capacity and interest to pay for local services and aims to provide good quality services that meet producers' expectations and that are available at an affordable price.

Under the LEAN project, the communities first identified 652 local service providers (LSP) who received 3 days of training as well as a 3 day refresher from public and private sector experts. At the beginning, most of the LSPs provided their community services on a voluntary basis and free of service charge in the areas of agriculture and livestock. The LSPs progressively became aware of the potential demand from producers

and their willingness to pay for services. Then after some days they start to collect service charge for giving Promotion of "Private Rural Service Provision" quality services. A large number of LSPs have since on the basis of the identified service gap started to offer skilled services (selling inputs and/or between the farmers and the line agencies technical services) in addition to their regular advisory (public sector, NGOs and private sector) lead to emerge services (e.g. business planning, seed selling, seedling organic manure, spraving, vaccination, The scope of services by GOs, Private sector and the treatment etc.). This has led to a significant expansion of their market share and income. So far, now almost 100 LSPs are engaged in selling services to the Along with government organization public and private communities. A real local service market has emerged

Finally, with the support of LEAN Project, the private Considering this situation, the local service providers sector has actively entered into the market. It supports and facilities to access in guality inputs. Furthermore, the private sector has regularly used them as local input sellers with the added value of advisory services to expand their business. From the beginning, the challenges of promoting local service provision has exceeded its objectives, resulting in an impressive emergence of dynamic self-initiatives by LSPs. The increasing participation of the private sector and line agencies will help these activities to become more sustainable.



Bhutto Tonchonga is a proud example for his community through cultivating nutritious

vegetables and selling them for a fair price. Many in his community cite his name as an example of a good producer.

There are more producers like Bhutto in Chittagong Hill Tracts (CHT); those who have benefitted through

hutto Tonchonga, an example of good technical support from the government agriculture office. He was oriented on methods of cultivation, ways to prevent crop diseases and related knowledge on agriculture practices that matches his local area.

> Thanks to this support, Bhutto was able to invest 20,000 taka in his land for maintenance and cultivation of crops which grossed him 30,000-35,000 in income. His net profit after deducting all expenses is about 10,000-15,000 taka.

Leadership to Ensure Adequate (LEAN) Nutrition project.

Bhutto belongs to Tonchongya the community in Rangamati hill district. Before getting acquainted with the LEAN project, his crop production was very low because



of poor seed access. He could not sell his crops because of limited access to relevant value chains and competition with larger producers.

In such a helpless situation, the LEAN project became a blessing to him. With the help of LEAN staff, he learned about good seed storage and identification. He collected good quality bringle, flat bean and nut seeds from seed vendors.

Across his 33.5 decimal land, Bhutto cultivated all those crops. He also get primary knowledge and

crop quality. After that, the LSPs sell these nutritious products to Rangamati. Through all of this process Bhutto is very happy now and thankful to LEAN staff and the European Union for the project and for helping him bring changes in his livelihood. He hoped that little by little LEAN project will make a big change in his community, if the flow of the work continues this way.
